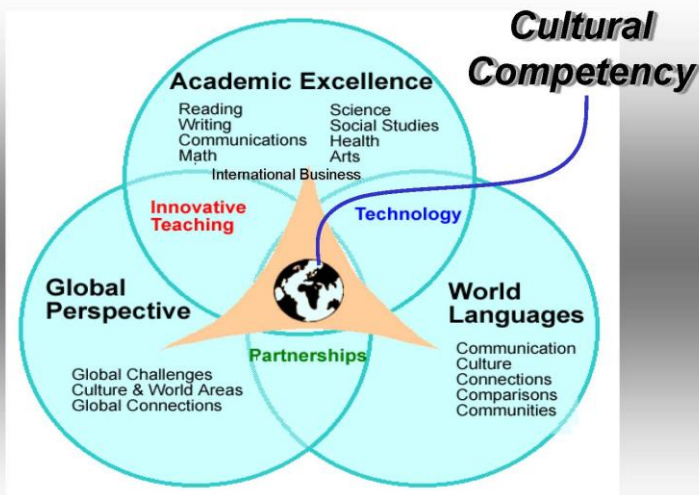


What Does an Internationalized School Look Like? ■ ■ ■

The John Stanford Int'l School Program

- We are a Seattle Public School
 - District curriculum as a foundation
- Japanese & Spanish Language Immersion Tracks
 - Students choose a language track at kindergarten
 - Math and Science taught primarily in the target language in K-3
 - Math and Social Studies taught primarily in target language in 4-5
 - Literacy taught in both English and immersion language
- Bilingual Orientation Center – Int'l Students Learning English
- Global Perspective Incorporated into All Subject Areas
 - Literature (ex. international-themed read alouds, comparison of fairy tales from around the world, etc.)
 - Science (ex. biodiversity and conservation in Washington and Africa)
 - Mathematics (ex. introducing algebra and its Islamic roots, using multiple algorithms)
- International Arts Program in Partnership with Washington Arts Commission, Seattle International Arts Consortium, Seattle International Children's Festival (Giant Magnet)
- International Trips for Students Each Year to Puerto Vallarta, Mexico and Japan
- International/ Intercultural School Events (ex. La Fiesta Latina, Japan Night, International Dinner, International Arts Celebration, International Music Performances, Literacy Night, Math Night)
- Technology as a Tool for Learning & Communicating (Computer lab, Sound-field systems, Webcam, iEARN, Smart Boards, e-Instruction pads, iMovies, etc.)
